Open Doors works in over 60 countries, supplying Bibles, training church leaders, providing practical support and emergency relief, and supporting Christians who suffer for their faith. In the UK and Ireland Open Doors works to raise awareness of global persecution, mobilising prayer, support and action among Christians.


The 'World Watch List' is a global survey produced annually by Open Doors in January. It measures the degree of freedom Christians have to live out their faith in five spheres of life - private, family, community, national and church life - plus a sixth sphere measuring levels of violence.

Persecution is more than violence and destruction. This year many countries rose on the World Watch List, not because they turned more violent, but because of increased social, legal and structural oppression. Governments are increasingly aided in this task by personal digital technology.

But it's not all bad news! There is light in the darkness, and the courageous faith of Christians is evident, even in the harshest conditions. Persecution is rising – but that only happens where the church is actively sharing the the gospel and living it out.

“We are on a mission to release thousands of families from grinding poverty through award winning debt counselling and community groups. By equipping and empowering local churches to reach out on their doorsteps, we're bringing hope to over 21,500 families every year.”

In a society where people live behind closed doors, thousands are desperately poor. Unable to feed their children, incapable of paying to heat their homes in winter, the grip of poverty is relentless. It breaks families apart and drives many to think that suicide is the only solution.

CAP local centre teams visit families at home, run community-based group services and invite clients to church, offering vital companionship and support that lasts long after their time with CAP has ended.

Many people are facing impossible situations with no way out – except God. CAP are so grateful for the dedication of supporters who pray regularly for their work. Thousands of families go debt free and hundreds respond to Christ each year, thanks to prayer.
